- First, the Rafiki Bible Study is changing the way I view the Bible as I work through the studies with my coworkers and in a small group. I am so thankful for the Bible study and the opportunity to teach from it in Africa. Theologically-rich, it challenges me to make connections, ask questions, and strengthens my love of Scripture.
