Construction of the Rafiki Institute of Classical Education (RICE) began on September 1. When it is completed in the Spring of 2017, it will be a training center for aspiring teachers who will learn how to teach using the Christian classical method.



ChildCare Program

At the Rafiki Village in Nigeria, we are rejoicing not only in the transformations taking place in the Village, but also those taking place in the lives of the Rafiki children. They are living examples of children striving to learn to live a Christian life. Sunday, they gave an item of their own to orphans at a local children's home sheltering orphans resulting from Boko Haram attacks in Northern Nigeria.

His leg is now free of infection and is healing. *Pray, by God's grace, Jonah may be able to walk normally again.*


Prayer Requests
