Hope and Change

Can we ever get enough stories about "Hope and Change"? Do you ever wonder if the time, money, and effort spent teaching and mentoring is truly making an eternal difference? We have been steadily preparing the ground (children and staff), planting the seeds (sowing God's Word), and watering the ground (mentoring). God is actively at work in their lives because of (and sometimes in spite of) our best efforts. Now where is the fruit?

Meet Isaac: Isaac came to the Rafiki Village in Nigeria in February of 2004, soon after the Rafiki Village first opened. Isaac's mother died from a long illness when he was three years old and his father was unknown. His elderly grandfather, an impoverished widower, was taking care of Isaac's five older siblings. Social welfare and the grandfather thought it best for Isaac to come to Rafiki Village so he would have a chance to thrive.

Today Isaac attends a Government Technical High School in Bukuru studying auto mechanics. He stays at the school and comes home during school breaks. He says it is very challenging and not everyone makes it. We just got word of his report. Isaac is first in his class at Bu-Tech! Lots of preparation by many people here at Rafiki helped him apply himself successfully in a new setting.

We know we can do nothing apart from God. We know God is good. We know God is faithful and loves us. And we know we can trust God to complete His plans.

Harvest

What do you do when you are waiting for rain and a fruitful harvest? You put one foot in front of the other and do the work God gives to you each day. You spread fertilizer (God's Word) to make the soil fertile. For Doug that might mean fixing a leaky faucet for the umpteenth time. Carolyn looks at a cut finger and applies ointment and bandaids. Susy teaches her students how to correctly complete math problems—again. Erica patiently helping her students to stand in a straight line and teaching them to sing the hymn of the week for school's opening assembly time.

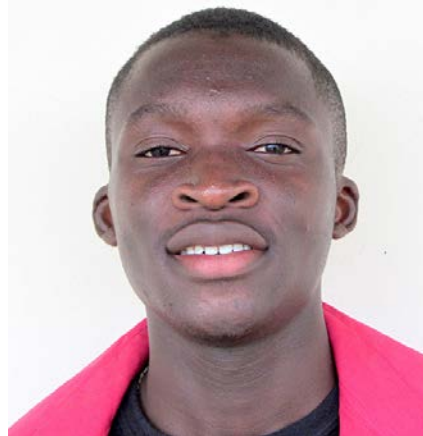
- Organizing a Rafiki Student Council—the older children will meet to learn how to guide and serve others.
