Dear family and friends,

Doug and Carolyn are starting their seventh two-year term with Rafiki Foundation. Come join us in serving God by serving the orphaned children in Africa and teaching them about His love for them. Our days are never boring and often include unexpected blessings.

Doug has been working on a new fort with monkey bars and a bridge, which was given by a generous family. One day he received a special note from one of the children. *"To Uncle Doug, God bless you. You are my best friend. Thank you for making the fort and bridge. I love you very, very much".* Love, Centia

This week one of our blessings included news that God has provided funds to begin building a much-needed pre-school. In the next couple months much needs to be done: excavating for the foundation, putting in ground beams, in-ground plumbing, and laying the floor slab. Block making has begun and thousands of them will be made by the time the floor is done.

Another unexpected blessing was welcoming a new child "home to Rafiki". Our newest child is eighteen-month-old Jean (pronounced John). Local officials asked Rafiki to help him after his mother died, leaving him with no family. Neighbors who

were caring for Jean had two children of their own and were expecting a new baby soon. They were all living in part of a half built structure. He desperately needed rescuing.

Jean has begun settling in with his new family. Rafiki Mother Jeanette introduced him to his four new brothers, who welcomed him with open arms. He can be seen with his brothers, who excitedly take his hand to help him explore his new home.

Each morning everyone at Rafiki gathers to sing praises to God, to pray, and to study God's Word. We study using the Rafiki Bible Study (RBS), which is a thirteen-year survey of the Bible with lessons appropriate for each age level, from pre-school to adult. RBS is also an integral part of the Rafiki school curriculum, through which the children receive a quality education integrated with a biblical worldview.

This is happening in all ten Rafiki Villages, and in each church school which partners with Rafiki. It is no exaggeration to say that God is using the RBS to change tens of thousands of hearts across Africa! Rafiki seeks to cultivate minds and hearts to love God, to love their neighbors, and to love all that is true, good, and beautiful, and the RBS is making a great impact. Doug and I have the privilege to participate in, as well as lead the Rafiki Bible Study.

One of our Rafiki teachers recently shared that the RBS has taught him about who God is and what His attributes are. He said he had never learned so much about God before, and this has made a big difference in his life. It has also helped him be much more effective in sharing the gospel message with others, including his students.
