Dear family and friends,

"It's ok, please don't cry." Seeing a child in pain is difficult! As a parent, you want to hold them and "make everything all better." As a healthcare provider, you want to "find and treat the cause." A child with pain, our daughter Sarah, just wants to do normal teenager things like run, jump, and walk to classes.

When Doug and I came home in May, we had no idea we would spend the next three months in Texas taking care of our daughter, Sarah.

In March, Sarah developed an unusual case of deep vein thrombosis in her left leg and hip. She has been hospitalized three times for blood thinners and pain control. Her pain should be gone by now, but it is not.

Last year, Sarah had already made plans to stay in Abilene with Doug's mom to complete her senior year. She wants to be a nurse (like her mom). Monday was her first day of school at Holland Medical High School.

Doug is heading back to Rwanda on September 5 to be there before our Village director Mike Koch leaves to have his painful knees examined by his doctor in the States.

Please pray with us for Sarah's complete healing and for Doug and Carolyn to be able to return full time to Rafiki Village Rwanda.

We declare His marvelous deeds and thank Him for His blessings to us!

Doug, Carolyn, and Sarah have been blessed by the McReynolds family who have graciously hosted and put up with us during our longer stay in Texas this summer.

Rafiki Village Rwanda has been blessed by MiniMissionaries who have helped make our team members' loads lighter while we have been in the States. We have heard good reports that the children and staff are healthy and growing in their knowledge of the Lord. The Village has been safe and secure but has been experiencing frequent power outages.

It was wonderful to be able to visit, show them pictures, talk about the children, and thank them in person for their generosity.
