The Rafiki Foundation has the privilege of making disciples of the next generation of the world. Like the young community student at our school in Malawi pictured on the front.

The next generation of the world you say? Yes. Why? How?

Statistics show that half of the world's children will be born in Africa over the next 25 years, totaling 1.2 billion young people. At Rafiki, we believe God has equipped us with a strategy and resources to assist the church in nurturing the next generation of godly contributors across Africa and beyond.

Africa boasts some of the world's largest church denominations, with Rafiki privileged to partner with 25 of them. Through over 40 years of dedicated work, we've built strong relationships with denominations serving over 60 million Christians and 20,000 schools. Imagine the impact if Rafiki's curriculum, Bible studies, and resources flowed through our ten Rafiki Villages to these church partners to aid in disciple-making!

Many African church schools, while Christian in name, lack doctrinally sound materials and rely solely on secular government curricula. Through God's provision and partnerships, Rafiki enables these schools to adopt our classical Christian curriculum. Moreover, Bibles and Bible studies are often inaccessible to many Africans. Rafiki's resources aim to address this gap, helping the African church disciple the next generation effectively.

In 2023, Rafiki collaborated with Ligonier Ministries, Crossway, and the Rosemary Jensen Bible Foundation to distribute over 45,700 Bibles to our African partner denominations, totaling more than 100,000 since 2017. We also provided 4,500 sets of Sunday school materials to churches across Africa. This year, we aim to distribute an additional 100,000 Bibles.



Within our ten Rafiki Villages, we operate PreK-12 classical Christian schools where students receive daily Bible study, education from a biblical worldview, and two meals a day. These schools serve as vital environments for disciple-making alongside families and churches.

We are grateful for the high demand for our schools, with one country having a waiting list of 600 children. Through our Orphan Care Program, hundreds of orphans are now pursuing tertiary education and entering various professions, embodying a biblical worldview in fields such as architecture, finance, medicine, and more across ten countries.

Beyond our schools, Rafiki operates teacher training colleges. We anticipate accrediting six Rafiki Institute of Classical Education (RICE) Programs as degree-granting institutions in the coming year. RICE Programs not only produce skilled teachers who go to work in schools, but also disciples equipped in theology, church history, and core subjects.

We eagerly anticipate what God will accomplish through Rafiki in Africa and beyond in the years ahead. Thank you for joining us in celebrating God's ongoing work through the Rafiki Foundation.

What are our goals to disciple the next generation of the world?

EQUIPPING THE AFRICAN CHURCH

BIBLE DISTRIBUTION TO OUR CHURCH PARTNERS

Excitement coursed through the pastors as they waited in eager anticipation to receive their gifts. Hundreds of empty boxes indicated the vast amount of resources they gathered to welcome and produced tremendous joy in their celebration.

The distribution of the gifts commenced, and soon 4000 pastors from the Church of Uganda held in their hands a most precious gift—the Bible.

Early in 2023, members of the Home Office loaded a 40-foot container with boxes containing 4000 *Reformation Study Bibles*. These Bibles, provided by Ligonier Ministries, crossed the seas and arrived in Uganda for a summer Bible distribution. Word spread throughout the Church of Uganda, and many traveled to join in the celebration. The distribution took place on a soccer pitch, the only available location that accommodated the 1700 attendees. Among this number stood Archbishop Stephen Kaziimba who joined three members of Rafiki in delivering Bibles into the hands of pastors.

For most of these individuals, this experience was new. To have access to, much less own, a study Bible is rare among African pastors. A study Bible in Africa can cost up to a month's salary for a pastor in rural Africa.

A similar distribution occurred in Nigeria earlier this year. The Lord provided 2000 study Bibles, a means to ship them, and individuals to deliver them to members of ECWA (Evangelical Churches Winning All). The recipients of these Bibles were indigenous missionaries from ECWA's mission organization, the Evangelical Missionary Society. They serve in 19 countries, reaching the unreached throughout West Africa and beyond. Upon receiving the Bibles, the missionaries broke out singing, "What shall we say unto the Lord? We can only say to him we're grateful."

These Bible distributions and others like them equip our African church partners to steward the Word of God and its right teaching to his people.

BIBLE STUDIES FOR THE HOME, SCHOOL, AND CHURCH

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND SMALL GROUPS

The Rafiki Bible Study (RBS) is offered in three different versions: Sunday school lessons, small group studies, and classroom/homeschool lessons. Each version caters to meet the needs of the group. Sunday school lessons

available for 12 books. Lead your own group, acquire lessons for your Sunday school class, or teach your children or grandchildren God's Word using the RBS! In addition to Bible study material you may also purchase commentaries to complement your study from Rafiki at special rates.

SCHOOLS AND HOME SCHOOL

One of Rafiki's 2024 goals is to have 100 schools in the USA using Rafiki's materials. Imagine children in 100 schools beginning their day studying God's Word! The RBS for schools is designed so all age groups study the same passage of Scripture each day. From preschool to grade 12, each student learns deep biblical truths and the glory of God at an age-appropriate level. The teachers even have their own study!

At the end of each week, students receive Home Devotion Pages that summarize the week's Bible lesson. Many students share these pages with their families, spreading the truth of God's Word as their loved ones study together. A hymn is included with each Home Devotion Page so that children and their families can not only learn about God but praise him in song. What a difference the RBS could make for schools as it grounds students on the Bible, shapes their worldview, and teaches them to worship God with wonder and awe!

RAISING GODLY CONTRIBUTORS

ORPHAN CARE PROGRAM

For over 20 years, Rafiki's ten Orphan Care Programs have been dedicated to the promotion of the spiritual and emotional wellbeing of our children and to cultivating a family environment in which each child could have the opportunity to follow God's plan and purpose for his or her life. We have had the privilege of touching the lives of 907 children. So far, 334 have finished high school, and 302 have been granted a Rafiki Scholarship to pursue further education and training. They are studying a wide-range of fields such as civil engineering, accounting, sociology, education, medicine and surgery, architecture, nursing, cooking, law, youth ministry, forestry, and much more.

NINETY-THREE HAVE COMPLETED THEIR TERTIARY EDUCATION, AND 81 ARE EMPLOYED AND SUPPORTING THEMSELVES. Ninety-three have completed their tertiary education, and 81 are employed and supporting themselves. We are happy that more than 10% have

become teachers, passing on the excellent education they received to future generations. Some have gotten married and begun families of their own.

One of our young men in Ghana who came to Rafiki when he was five-years old, is now twenty-seven and has been teaching at the Rafiki School for several years. He received a Rafiki Scholarship to pursue a diploma program (similar to an associate's degree) and is now working on a bachelor's degree. He recently requested his former Rafiki Mother to accompany him when he went to speak to his girlfriend's mother to inquire about marriage. He is now engaged to a lovely Christian young woman.

TRAINING TEACHERS, MAKING DISCIPLES

TEACHERS COLLEGE

Rafiki's RICE (Rafiki Institute of Classical Education) Programs train Africans to teach classically. Once trained these teachers serve in Rafiki Schools or in schools that adopt our education system. We offer this training through several modalities.

Two- or three-year diploma (associate's degree) programs are offered in Kenya, Liberia, Nigeria, Uganda, and Zambia. In several countries—Liberia, Malawi, Nigeria, Zambia, and Uganda—we are partnering either with local universities or the National Council for Higher Education to offer degree programs (four-year bachelor's degrees).

The Post Graduate Studies Program allows already credentialed teachers to attend and learn about classical education. This one-year work-study program in Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Rwanda, and Tanzania provides hands-on training through working in the Rafiki School.

ELIJAH FELT HE HAD A SECOND CHANCE TO FULFILL HIS DREAM OF BEING A TEACHER! Elijah Mugo is one of many individuals who benefited from the RICE Program at Rafiki Village Kenya. Elijah desired to pursue a teaching degree

but struggled to fund his tuition. He encountered a Rafiki teacher who told him about the tuition-free RICE Program. Elijah felt like he had a second chance to fulfill his dream of being a teacher! But what really caught his attention was the classical Christian view of education. He had never heard of anything like it. Elijah enrolled in RICE and is now thrilled to learn not only teaching but to be drawn to the source of all truth—God. He shares the truth that he is learning in RICE by teaching at one of Rafiki's outreach schools in Nairobi. Elijah is making disciples as Jesus commands.

ENRICHING AND EQUIPPING LIVES

RAFIKI SCHOOL PROGRAM

Students are enriched and equipped in our schools with opportunities to serve, compete, and consider their callings. The junior high students in Ghana volunteered at a school for special needs children and carried out a Socratic dialogue on their experience when they returned home. In Uganda, students participated in a national chess tournament and students in Tanzania went up against another local school in a math and debate competition. Career days have been held at several Rafiki schools with a variety of professionals visiting to tell students about their jobs and how they got into their fields.

SOCRATIC DIALOGUE AND MORE

Opportunities for equipping and enrichment also extend to our teachers. Last October at the New Old Way Conferences (Rafiki's classical Christian education conferences) in Uganda and Kenya, representatives from every Rafiki School attended and all schools have seen great fruit from this experience. A head teacher in Nigeria found the session on Socratic discussion so transformative that he developed his own presentation on the topic and shared it with schools in Nigeria who are adopting the Rafiki Curriculum. Head teachers in Ghana shared with faculty about their deepened understanding of the liberal arts, how anthropology impacts curriculum and methodology, and developing the virtue of our students. These conferences continue to bear fruit in our national staff, and we are confident that attendees from other schools were equally impacted.

FROM DESTITUTE TO DOCTOR

When Naomie's mother became ill and died, a family friend took in the young girl. The friend cared diligently and lovingly for Naomie, but after a time, she could no longer provide for the needs of the growing child. Social welfare investigated the situation, and Naomie was soon approved to move to her new home—the Rafiki Village Rwanda.

Six-year-old Naomie quickly fell in love with her Rafiki



family and especially cherished their family devotions. She delighted in reading and memorizing God's Word and prayed faithfully for each member of her Rafiki family and the Village staff. As Naomie grew, she displayed the qualities of a natural leader, gently guiding and caring for the younger children in the Village. She observed her Rafiki Mother and other staff as they worked and played with the children and sought to emulate their actions.

Naomie developed a child-like wonder for God and came to saving faith, just as the missionaries and staff prayed she would. Her love for her Savior continued to grow throughout her time at the Rafiki Village.

In 2023 the Village celebrated Naomie and her classmates as the first graduating class. Due to her hard work and godly character, she qualified for a Rafiki scholarship. Unfazed by the competitive acceptance process, Naomie

applied to the University of Global Health Equity. She was delighted to receive an invitation to an interview! After two interviews, the school accepted Naomie into the program to pursue a bachelor's degree in medicine. Of the many students who applied across the continent of Africa, only 60 were chosen. In addition to being accepted, Naomie received a full scholarship from the university that covers tuition and living expenses as she pursues her desire to become a surgeon.

As she waited a year for her studies to begin, Naomie made the most of her time serving as an administrative assistant at the Rafiki School. She commenced her

bachelor's degree in June 2024. The program requires seven years of school and five years of medical service in Rwanda. Once Naomie completes this time, she can practice medicine where ever she desires.

The light of Christ shines through Naomie as she sets a beautiful example in academics, friendship, teamwork, faith, and perseverance. The Lord has used her in many ways, and we know he will continue to do so!

IMPACTING ONE LIFE TO IMPACT A NATION

In a remote village in Moshi, Masama English Medium Pre and Primary School, a small school on the outskirts of Mount Kilimanjaro, is in session. Their first subject of the day: Bible.

In 2013, Headmistress Aneth Swai attended the Rafiki Institute of Classical Education (RICE) in Tanzania for six months. While there, she received instruction on studying and teaching the Word of God, learning more deeply the truths of the Bible and how to be a biblically based educator.

After her time at RICE, Aneth began work at a school, introducing the Rafiki Bible Study (RBS) and sharing the wisdom she received in RICE.

"The eagerness of learning [God's Word] increased much when I was in the RICE Program. I was overwhelmed and I started to feel like others also would like to know about God and his love. Since I am an educator, I felt like the best place to start was in school with my students."

PARENTS FROM DIFFERENT REGIONS ARE REQUESTING FOR ADMISSION TO BRING THEIR CHILDREN TO THIS PARTNER SCHOOL Students travel to this school from as far as Dar es Salaam and Tanga, a full day's journey by car, to receive an education that teaches God's truth.

"My school was the second school to teach RBS after Rafiki Foundation School, so many parents appreciated the way their children are transformed much in knowing God personally and behaving well at home. Parents started to share this news with others in their normal conversation. The other parents started to be curious about our school and how we teach RBS. The nearby parents also travel into different regions... During their travel, they share with other people in their

conversation about their children and the school they are attending. Then the news about our school started to spread like a wildfire. From there, parents from different regions are requesting for admission to bring their children to our school... Students who are graduating from our school from those regions are used to inspire others through their good behavior and knowledge about God to come and join us.

There are great changes in our students' lives. First, the habit of reading the Word of God is well grounded in their hearts and mind. They are enjoying learning about God and his love toward his people. Everyday they are reading [the] Bible, and it is the part of their life now.

Second, the Word of God impacted their behavior very much. The way they are treating each other with love, care, gentleness, the way they are respecting their teachers, parents, and other adults—it is the impact of learning about God.

Third, they teach other family members and siblings about God through Scripture, and to teach them how to pray... The kind of life they are living at home is also imitated by other children at home and in the neighborhood."

This is one of the many ways God allows the Rafiki Foundation to serve—by sharing the truth of God and ensuring schools have access to his Word and to resources like the Rafiki Bible Study. By God's grace, they can dive deeper into his Word and cultivate a greater love for the Lord our God.

MAKING DISCIPLES IN THE USA

RAFIKI CLASSICAL ACADEMY

"To God be the glory! Great things he has done!" resounded through Rafiki Classical Academy (RCA) on May 31, 2024. Students, teachers, parents, Rafiki Home Office Staff, and community supporters gathered to praise God for the successful completion of the Academy's inaugural year. From September 2023 through May 2024, kindergarten through third grade students received a classical Christian education at the Rafiki Home Office, where RCA leases classroom space. Through the Rafiki Curriculum and Rafiki Bible Study, RCA students grew in knowledge of God's Word and world, honed skills they will use for the rest of their lives, and developed wisdom and virtue. To God be the glory, indeed!

What's next for Rafiki Classical Academy? Growth! The local community is taking note of the great things God is doing at RCA and there has been a steady stream of new student applicants. For the 2024/2025 academic year, the Academy's enrollment is increasing from 18 to 55 students, the teaching faculty is tripling in size, and pre-kindergarten, fourth, and fifth grade classes are being added. The Academy's facilities are expanding, too. Rafiki Classical Academy is grateful to be leasing an additional building at the Rafiki Home Office while RCA awaits modulars. The modulars will provide further space for the Academy's continued anticipated growth while funds are raised to build a PreK-12th grade school next door to the Rafiki Home Office. Not only is Rafiki Classical Academy growing but it is replicating by helping a local churches start classical Christian schools through providing training and the Rafiki Curriculum. EQUIPPING CHURCH PARTNERS TO MAKE DISCIPLES

OUTREACH PROGRAM IN AFRICA

The Outreach Program operates in all ten Rafiki countries, with 63 schools in seven countries serving more than 4500 children. Rafiki supplies these schools and children with the Rafiki Education System which includes classical Christian curriculum, daily Bible study, and Bibles for all students who are able to read. Rafiki also assists in outfitting the libraries in each school. We continue to have enquiries about adding schools to this number.

Last year, we hosted Rafiki Classical Conferences in Uganda and Kenya. Displayed Rafiki Bible Studies and school curriculum brought much interest and many excellent questions. We eagerly anticipate our 2024 Classical Conference in Nigeria where we will continue to spread classical Christian education and Bible study internationally.

Our church partner in Tanzania has recently introduced the RBS into 22 of its schools. This Bible study is conducted in every classroom every day of the week by local teachers who have been trained at the Rafiki Village in Moshi. The book-by-book study covers every book of the Bible and includes Bible readings, group study questions, memory verses, catechism, and hymns.

A team from the Rafiki Home Office recently visited the Masama Primary School in Tanzania and were treated to a recitation of memory verses as well as a song from the *Rafiki Hymnal*. Students proudly displayed their new Bibles which were given to them by Rafiki and Crossway Publishing. See Stories of Impact for more information.

Sponsor a child from the community to attend a Rafiki School in Africa. The cost to support a child for a year is \$1200 and provides a daily Bible study, two meals a day, and a classical Christian education. Participate for a minimum of \$25 a month.

Start a Rafiki Bible Study for groups in your neighborhood. Studies range from four to 32 weeks, beginner to advanced and are for men's, women's, couple's, or college-age groups.

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

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
